>> Homeowner: We lived in a two bedroom. It was tight quarters. So I researched organizations that were educating individuals on homeownership process and how to get help buying your home and that's how I came across Manna.

>> Manna spokesperson 1: Manna is a nonprofit affordable housing developer.

We've created and developed 1200 homes for low and moderate income families.

Although in the country people may be spending 25 to 30 percent of their income on housing, in Washington, D.C. there are families that are spending 50 percent.

>> Manna spokesperson 2: There are two real components. One, we do financial literacy and we help people understand credit and budget.

And then number two is a roadmap solely designed for you to be able to obtain homeownership.

>> Homeowner: They worked with me and helped me to find a house, and helped me take classes so that I could get the resources that I need to assist me in buying my house.

>> Manna spokesperson 1: Support like Wells Fargo offers is important because it keeps Manna stable.

As a nonprofit organization it allows us to continue to do what we do in homebuyer education and credit counseling and in homeownership opportunities.

>> Homeowner: For me it's a really huge accomplishment, and I'm really proud of myself.

I want it to be a part of my legacy, and it just feels great, it's wonderful.
